THE ROCK GARDEN OF CHANDIGARH

The Rock Garden of Chandigarh, also known as Nek Chand's Rock Garden, is a unique sculpture garden in Chandigarh, India. Founded by Nek Chand, a government official, who began secretly creating the garden in 1957, it now spans approximately 40 acres (161,874.25 m²). This eco-friendly marvel is constructed entirely from industrial and home waste, as well as discarded items. The garden is celebrated for its intricate sculptures made from recycled ceramics and other materials like bangles, ceramic pots, tiles, bottles, and electrical waste. It skillfully blends landscape, architecture, sculpture, and mythology, resembling a fantasy lost kingdom with 14 distinct chambers, including a forecourt. Continue to page - 02







Major Attractions:

- Phase 1: Features sculptures of humans and animals created from toilet fixtures, broken glass pieces, and broken tiles.
- Phase 2: Depicts a small traditional Indian village with beautifully carved huts, temples, and pathways.
- Phase 3: Inspired by Roman architecture and includes swings for visitor enjoyment, a waterfall, aquariums with various fishes, and an open-air theatre with stair seating.
- Additional Attractions: Laughing mirror display, camel and train rides, a dolls museum, a souvenir shop, and a food court.

Special Events:

The Rock Garden hosts the Teej festival, during which it takes on a festive atmosphere and becomes a special attraction for tourists.


Visitor Tips:


- Best Time to Visit: Early morning or late afternoon to avoid the midday heat.

- Accessibility: Suitable for visitors of all ages; however, some pathways may be uneven.





VOTE FOR PEOPLE'S CHOICE 2024: CHANDIGARH'S DESTINATION

Start Date: 7th March, 2024, End Date: 15th October, 2024

The Ministry of Tourism, Government of India, invited participation in Dekho Apna Desh, People's Choice 2024. This initiative allowed people to vote for their favorite tourist attractions, helping the Ministry identify and develop destinations for Viksit Bharat@2047. Participants could choose from five categories: Spiritual, Cultural & Heritage, Nature & Wildlife, Adventure, and Other. Voting was open from 7th March 2024 to 15th October 2024.

To vote, participants had to register online using an OTP sent to their mobile number or email ID. They needed to select at least one attraction they had visited and one they wished to visit in the future. Votes were submitted through an online form where participants could choose up to three attractions in each category.


Upon submission, participants received a certificate of participation, shareable on social media. The attractions with the highest votes were to be developed further by the Ministry, with the final decision resting with the Ministry. No appeals were entertained.

A potential lucky draw could have rewarded participants with a trip to an incredible site in India. Winners had to comply with the rules and provide necessary documents. The Ministry's decisions on the lucky draw and winners were final.

Eligibility criteria included residency in India or abroad, with Indian participants needing a mobile number and international participants needing an email ID. Each participant could vote only once. Participants had to provide accurate information and follow the terms and conditions. The Ministry reserved the right to disqualify any participant violating the rules. Changes to terms and conditions could have occurred at the Ministry's



discretion.







How to reach:

Airport: It is well-connected to the rest of the country and has direct flights to Delhi, Mumbai, Jaipur, Bengaluru, Srinagar and other cities. Air India and indigo offer two international flights to Dubai.



Train: The Chandigarh railway station has good connections to the metros. It is connected to Delhi and other major cities. Vande Bharat and Shatabdi run from Chandigarh to other destinations.



Road: The inter-state bus terminals (ISBT) in sector 17 and in sector 43 have daily buses to the different state.



Where to stay: Hotel Mount View, Hotel Shivalik View, Hotel Park View, and UT-Guest-2 House are government accommodations. Additionally, many five-star, three-star, and mid-range budget options are available.



Best time to visit Chandigarh: Between September to April and Monsoons.



Temperature: Peak summers see a high of 48°C while in winters the temperature dips to 2 - 3°C.
